1. AB 1771	BLOOM	Makes changes to the regional housing needs allocation (RHNA) plan objectives, methodology, distribution, and appeals process.
2. AB 1999	CHAU	Establishes net neutrality rules for local agencies that provide broadband services and expands the types of local agencies that may provide broadband infrastructure, services, or both.
3. AB 2050	CABALLERO	Creates the Small System Water Authority Act of 2018, which authorizes the creation of small system water authorities that will have powers to absorb, improve, and operate noncompliant public water systems.
4. AB 2184	CHIU	Requires a local agency that licenses businesses to accept a driver's license or certain identification numbers in lieu of a social security number (SSN), if the municipality otherwise requires an SSN for the issuance of a business license.
5. AB 2681	NAZARIAN	Requires each building department of a city or county to create an inventory of potentially seismically vulnerable buildings.
6. AB 2753	FRIEDMAN *	Requires a city or county to provide additional information to an applicant who is applying for a density bonus, when an application is deemed complete.
7. AB 2853	MEDINA	Requires local agencies to take specified actions before approving or granting economic development subsidies of \$100,000 or more for warehouse distribution centers and during the term of such subsidies.

8. AB 2880	HARPER	Authorizes the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) to administer and enforce a local campaign finance or government ethics law upon mutual agreement between the FPPC and a local agency with a population of less than three million people.
9. AB 2890	TING *	Revises, restructures, and expands accessory dwelling unit (ADU) and junior accessory dwelling unit (JADU) law.
10. AB 2911	FRIEDMAN	Makes various changes to fire safety planning efforts, defensible space requirements, and electrical transmission or distribution lines' vegetation clearance requirements with the intent to improve the fire safety of California communities.
11. AB 2920	THURMOND	Allows the City of Berkeley to adopt an ordinance proposing the imposition of a transactions and use tax that exceeds the 2% statutory limitation.

16. AB 3147	CABALLERO *	Limits fees and other charges for specified housing development projects to no m more than what was in effect at the time that the application for the housing development project was determined to be complete by the city or county.

17. AB 3160	GRAYSON	Requires the State Lands Commission to waive specified rights and issue a certification of compliance for the conveyance of property that is authorized for disposal or realignment by the federal government during the base realignment and closure process.
18. AB 3177	CHAVEZ	Repeals provisions of law requiring the North County Transit District (NCTD) to award contracts exceeding \$50,000 for supplies, equipment, and materials to the lowest responsible bidder and, instead, allows NCTD to establish and use a flexible process for these contracts and for service contracts.
