1.	AB 345	RIDLEY- THOMAS	Increases the fines that counties and cities may assess for violations of their ordinances and local building and safety codes.
2.	AB 428	RIDLEY- THOMAS	Eliminates a January 1, 2018, sunset date in existing law that allows county health authorities to establish a quorum pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act (Brown Act) when meeting via teleconference if at least 50% of the board members constituting the quorum are physically present within the boundaries of the authority's jurisdiction and other conditions are met, thereby extending this provision indefinitely.
3.	AB 556	LIMÓN	Increases the fine amounts that counties may assess for a violation of an event permit requirement that is an infraction.
4.	AB 678	BOCANEGRA	Makes a number of changes to the Housing Accountability Act (HAA).
5.	AB 709	McCARTY	Authorizes the Sacramento Regional Transit District to include specified information relating to transactions and use taxes in an ordinance calling for an election to issue debt.
6.	AB 915	TING	Requires, if the City and County of San Francisco has adopted an inclusionary housing ordinance, that the City and County apply that ordinance to the total number of housing units, including any additional housing units granted under a density bonus, unless the city, county or city and county exempts those additional units from the ordinance.

7.	AB 979	LACKEY	Makes changes to the statutes which govern the independent special district selection committee and representation of special districts on local agency formation commissions.
8.	AB 1436	LEVINE	Authorizes a county board of supervisors to adopt a resolution, by a majority vote instead of a four-fifths vote, to provide county aid for the improvement or maintenance of streets within a city.
9.	AB 1515	DALY	Establishes, for purposes of the Housing Accountability Act (HAA), a reasonable person standard for deeming consistency, as specified, for a housing development project or emergency shelter.
10.	AB 1568	BLOOM	Allows an enhanced infrastructure financing district (EIFD) to capture sales tax increment collected by a consenting local agency to be used on an infill site for specific purposes.
11.	AB 1725	LOCAL * GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE	Makes several non-controversial changes to the local agency formation commission (LAFCO) statutes which govern local government organization and reorganization.
