1. AB 346 DALY Authorizes a housing successor to use funds remaining in their Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund (LMIHF) towards a variety of homelessness services.
2. AB 352 SANTIAGO Prohibits a city or county from establishing a higher square footage requirement for efficiency units than what is specified in the International Building Code, and restricts a city or county from placing limitations on efficiency units located in certain areas.
3. AB 464 GALLAGHER * Makes changes to local agency formation commission (LAFCO) statutes which govern changes of organization and reorganization, including annexation proceedings.
4. AB 545 BIGELOW * Authorizes a private, nonprofit hospital in El Dorado County to enter into a joint powers agreement with a public agency.
5. AB 722 LIMÓN Authorizes a member of the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors or any public officer of the County or their deputies to serve on the Isla Vista Community Services District Board of Directors.
6. AB 734 BONTA Authorizes an infrastructure financing district (IFD) within the City of Oakland to finance public capital facilities or projects that include freight rail.
7. AB 747 GLORIA Authorizes the San Diego County tax collector, until January 1, 2023, to require specified taxpayers to make property tax bill payments through an electronic funds transfer or an electronic payment process.

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| 8. | AB 943 | SANTIAGO | Requires any ordinance that is submitted to the voters of a city that would curb, delay, or deter growth or development within the city, to be approved by at least two-thirds of the votes cast on it at the election in order to take effect. |
| 9. | AB 1538 | BONTA | Makes changes to the statutes which govern conditions in which the Alameda Health System can privatize services provided by physicians and surgeons. |
| 10. | AB 1613 | MULLIN | Authorizes the San Mateo County Transit District (SamTrans), subject to voter approval, to exceed the 2% transactions and use tax (TUT) limit at a rate of no more than 0.5%. |
